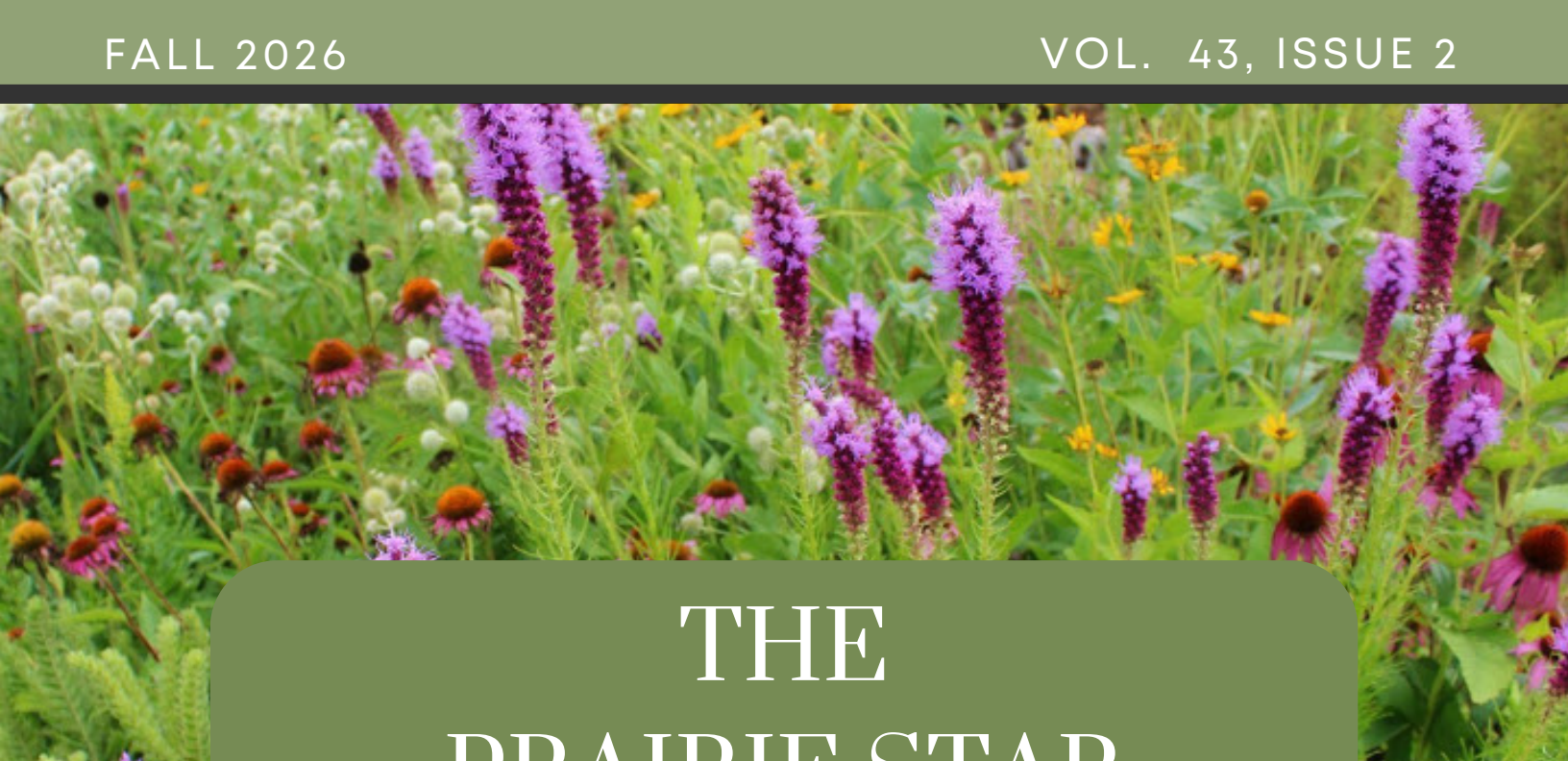

Nature Playscape Draws Many Visitors

The oxbow wetlands near the Environmental Learning Center are now complete and are easily visible looking southwest toward Spring Creek. Formed from a former bend in the stream, oxbow wetlands create calm, shallow habitats that support a wide variety of plants and wildlife. They also act as natural water filters and help manage flooding, adding both beauty and ecological value to Caldwell Park. Feel free to step off the trail for a closer look—if you're lucky, you might spot wildlife such as frogs and turtles beginning to move in!

MCCB UPDATES

Fish Habitat Structures are Now in Place at Popular Fishing Areas

This summer, Mahaska County Conservation staff and volunteers installed durable MossBack artificial fish habitat structures in White Oak Conservation Area Lake and Russell Wildlife Area Pond 1. Placed near popular fishing areas and in deeper water, the structures provide valuable cover for baitfish and predator species while improving fishing opportunities for years to come.

Maps showing the approximate locations of the underwater structures are available at Scanlon Bait & Tackle and the Environmental Learning Center. As more precise information becomes available, updated maps with GPS coordinates will be shared, along with a map for Russell Wildlife Area Pond 1.



This project was funded by an Iowa Department of Natural Resources Fish Habitat Grant. Thank you to the volunteers, partners, and supporters who helped make this project possible!

NATURE NOTES

Signs of the Season: Whitetail Deer Rubs

Each fall, white-tailed bucks rub their foreheads and antlers against trees, leaving behind patches of freshly exposed bark. Early in the season, rubbing helps remove velvet from newly hardened antlers and strengthens neck muscles for future sparring with other bucks.

A rub is more than a visual sign—it also carries scent from glands on the buck's forehead and near its eyes. This scent communicates the buck's presence and social status to other deer.



Some trees are rubbed repeatedly, while others are marked only once. Look for fresh white or orange wood on small trees along deer trails, woodland edges, and routes between bedding and feeding areas. When you spot a rub, you have discovered one of the whitetail's fascinating signs of fall!

The Christmas Bird Count (CBC), run by Audubon, is the nation's longest-running community science project. People around the country organize local counts between December 14-January 5 each year.

This year will be a trial run for the Mahaska County CBC. Participants will be assigned a sector of the anticipated 15 square mile circle to cover. The time is a guideline; participants are welcome to conduct their count at any time throughout the day. This program is open for all ages and skill levels; we will pair beginner birders with those who are more experienced. Since this is a trial run year, we will not be submitting the data collected to Audubon. We will still compile results to send to participants and post on social media.



We will meet at the Environmental Learning Center at noon to go over the morning's findings and to gather feedback for making this an official count in the future. Hot drinks and treats will be provided! For more information on the Christmas Bird Count, visit the Audubon CBC page.

Teamwork in Action Across Our County Parks

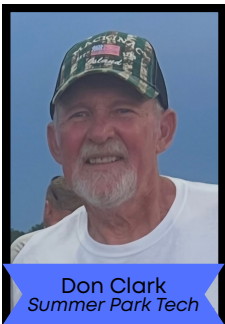
